The Los Angeles Lukers came to town on Oct. 16 to face the Dallas Mavericks and were celebrated by a sellout crowd numbering 10,274 at Fresno's Selland Arena. The night was highlighted by prolific performances from all-pro center Shaquille O'Neal and rookie sensation Kobe Bryant. The Lakers were victorious in a 90-80 game in which they used 13 different players.

The Mavericks jumped out to a quick 7-2 lead before the Lakers were forced to use a timeout. After the timeout, the Lakers rattled off seven unanswered points to take a 9-7 lead. The Mavericks would force several ties in the game but never regained the lead.

The Lakers start Elden Campbell, Cedric Ceballos, Shaquille O'Neal, Eddie Jones, and Nick Van Exel. Their bench strengths include the likes of veteran Jerome Kersey (formerly of Portland), Laker favorite Byron Scott and crowd pleaser Kobe Bryant.

"We're learning to play together and we're getting better because we're not being selfish," said O'Neal of the team's overall chemistry.

In a post-game interview Laker coach Del flarris talked about his team's performance: "It was worth playing haphazard to get Kobe in a tight situation. It was good experience for him. He did some good things. We didn't play real well but I'm very happy we were able to go down to the wire with two rookie guards." Derek Fisher and Bryant played the entire fourth quarter while starters Nick Van Exel and Eddie Jones cheered them on from the bench."Our bench was real strong tonight," said Van Exel who was limited to 22 minutes in favor of a rookie lineup in the fourth quarter.

Bryant is the second youngest player ever to play in an NBA game. Kobe will be 8 years, 2 months at the start of his rookie season. Portland's Jermaine O'Neal will be exactly 18 years. This is his rookie season as well. The former record was held by Stanley Brown in 1947. Bryant went to Lower Merion High School in Pennysylvania and is the first Laker in Franchise history to make the move from high school to the professional ranks.

While icing his sore ankle after the game. Bryant talked about his break away dunk in the fourth quarter which capitalized his rookie debut: "I wasn't going to something nasty because I had already turned my ankle. I just wanted to go up and do something with two hands."

The Lakers, who return only five players from last year's team, are a perfect 3-0 in this young exhibition season.

The California State University of Fresno took over the financially failing business of the Fresno City College cafeteria July 1, 1996. The cafeteria losses, ranging up to \$100,000 per year,

needed to be self sufficient, and it wasn't happening, so an outside source had to come in.

CSUF, which bid against the Have-a-snack corporation gave the State Center Community College District the best proposal, explained Jon Sharpe, Vice Chancellor of Bussiness. With this arrangement, the cafeteria will receive \$150,000 the first year for remodeling costs, and \$20,000 the following five years. After the five years,

FCC will receive six per cent or \$50,000 of the cafeteria profits that will be put into a fund for future use, destination un-

Both sources, such as Fresno State and fast food bussiness are a change for FCC and the district, but as Sharpe commented, "I trust that this arrangement will work, and continue to work well."

What about this ar-Work well for rangement? whom?

With the current lack of variety in the cafeteria, Yoshino's has improved sales dramatically. A portion of these profits combine with those of the Bookstore into one financial statement that goes to the district. So, there are increased profits in the bookstore, and no losses and future capital gains with the cafeteria. The district's financial outlook is rosy but with the current high cost of books and the limited parking situation, one has to wonder how these profits will benefit Fresno City College.


