### FCC greets eighteen thousand students with Welcome Week

Fresno City College's first Welcome Week proved a resounding success for incoming students in their initial week of class. Crew members of Welcome Week helped calm students' fears by responding to their questions and concerns.

With an estimated 18 thousand students enrolled at FCC this Fall, Associated Student Government President Adrian Rodriguez described Welcome Week as "a perfect example of what can be done to get students situated in a strange campus environment."

As a crew member, Rodriguez noted "how important it was to make information about classes, buildings and the campus readily accessible to new-comers." "For that reason, the booths and information centers were established to help ease the students into the city college system.

Members of Welcome Week, included volunteered staff, campus clubs and student government members, who wore yellow welcome week t-shirts to advertise their presence across campus and provide needed directions.

A number of students, including Clemente Valdivia and Robbie Loquaci, stated that because of Welcome Week, the first week of school has been "enjoyable", and they look forward to continuing their education at FCC.

After getting past the crowds in the parking lot and halls, the Welcome

### Student Center available to handicapped via new elevator

Reliable access is now available to the upper floor of the Fresno City College bookstore located on the south end of the campus.

For more than two years, the rail chair-lift installed on the front stairs of the bookstore, kept this FCC in compliance with State mandated guidelines for student and employee access. However, the chair-lift malfunc-

of complaining, changed the access situation. The college had always wanted an elevator for the bookstore and when funding for the improvement became available, the architect drew up the plans, and construction began last Spring.

The elevator stands about 10 feet from the South side of the bookstore and is linked to it by a covered walkway. A wheel-chair ramp is located just East of the walkway and the access doors are fully automated.

Although the appearance of the elevator does not match the original structure, it can be said that this addition compliments what was already there. Some comments were voiced about the 'lizard' insets seen near the top of the elevator's enclosure.

Citing an unidentified worker, "They were picked from a masonry catalog, and not considered a critical issue to the construction."

## Grant succeeds with "Blue Eyes"

Thanks to the recent success of Mafia movies, and the HBO Series "The Sopranos", it comes as no surprise that Hollywood would grasp the opportunity to make a smart Mafia comedy. Unlike last summer's "Mafia", the poorly written comedy which served as a horrid final tribute to the late Lloyd Bridges, "Mickey Blue Eyes" is a smart, witty play on marrying into mob.

One night at a dinner party, Michael confides in "Nice Uncle" Vito, about the troubles he is having at his art house, as well as the stiff competition from the local competitor, "Sotheby's". Shortly thereafter everything seems to fall into place as if by some. miracle. All complications at the art house have been resolved, and "Sotheby's" has closed their doors, thanks to a mysterious fire.

As if he had sold his soul to the devil, Michael is in way over his head; enangled in a

brilliant money laundering scheme, as well as the murder of "Nice Uncle" Vito's son. As a result Michael must enlist the help of Jenny's father Frank (James Caan), as they battle the internal conflict, as well as dodging the opposing Mafia "family", whom they framed for the murder.

Although the film tapers off to the typical, predictable romantic ending, Grant delivers a performance that will entertain more than just those with a Hugh Grant infatuation. The films wittier scenes come courtesy of Caan, who time and again, tries to teach Michael how to say such common mob phrases as "Forget about it" and "Get the hell outta here!", despite Michael's heavy English accent.

The benefit to "Mickey Blue Eyes", from a male perspective, is that you can finally take a date to a Hugh Grant romantic comedy, without being bored out of your mind.



Off in the distance vou hear the sound of the defense making the hits to echo the beginning of the Fresno City College football season. With the new season comes a new attitude.

With last season's retirement of Vance Stanley, the Rams named Tony Caviglia their new head coach. Caviglia, hired March 15th, comes from Chabot College in Hayward. With the new head coach comes four new coaching staff added to the four coaches retained from Stanley's staff.

Offensive coordinator

Scott Stark, who was recruited to play quarterback for Stanford also coached at the University. He then ran the secondary at Saddleback College in Mission Viejo, where they won the National Championship. He also worked with the Miami Dolphins. Returning from Stanley's staff are assistant head coach Rick Scheidt, offensive line coach Mike McClurg, defensive line coach Niko Liulamaga and secondary coach Curtis Allen.

"There are over 100 players trying out for the team; the guys are working hard in the weight room and out on the
