Flores' name will also be on a perpetual trophy supplied by the Fresno Junior Chamber of Commerce. The presentation was made by Bernie Silvia.



Collins was graduated from the Stanford University in 1926 and received his master's degree from the Pacific School of Religion in 1936. He did graduate work at Stanford, the College of Pacific, and the University of California.

In 1935-36 he accompanied an archeological expedition of the Pacific School of Religion to Mizpah in Palestine, seven miles north of Jerusalem.

Stuart M. White, the FJC president, said the new position has been established because of the junior college's rapidly increasing enrollment and the need for an administrator to study and evaluate the courses of study in order to improve curricular offerings.






