Jackson speaks on attaining right path

Former democratic presidential nominee whose champaign sparked seven million votes plus two million new voters, Rev.Jesse Jackson, visited Fresno Monday evening at Fresno State University to discuss the topic: "Reclaiming Democracy and Justice."

One of Jackson's main concerns was the lack of voting among the young generation. "If you're not voting, you're alling those that want to take it [America] back." stated Jackson. "If you're not registered, ,you're saying to Nelson Mandela, 'thank you, but no thank you,'" he continued.

Jackson also expressed his dismay with economic and social issues. "Most poor people are not on welfare. They work every day," said Jackson. "No job is beneath them. And when they get sick, they cannot afford the bed that they rest in," he stated.

"Embrace family. Women should

Overseas education available to students

Several Fresno City College students will get the chance to spend the 1997 Spring semester in Europe.

The England Study Abroad Program is an academic program available to college students that allows them to spend 14 weeks studying in England.

Two F.C.C instructors, Tim Quinn who teaches theater arts, and Mary Arechiga, who teaches English, will take a group of students from both

FCC and Kings River Community College on the England venture.

While in England, students must take a full compliment of courses; no fewer than 12 units, no more than 18. All units taken under the Study Abroad Program are transferable. Classes meet four days per week, giving students the other

three days to explore and experience Europe. Many side-trips are planned. Among them are a tour of London, visits to the London theaters, and a trip to Stratford.

The England Study Abroad Program costs approximately \$4,900, according to Arechiga, and includes round-trip air fare, and room and boarde with a British family. All students must have a valid passport.

To finance the trip, one thing many students do, Arechiga said, is sell their cars. They also use money received as gifts from friends and relatives. Many take extra jobs, and financial aid is also possible through the Financial Aid office. "It depends on how creative and how motivated they are on how they want to finance it," expressed Arechiga.

Arechiga also said that students can arrange beforehand to stay longer. "Students live with a British family, which I feel really completes the experience. You come back a changed person," she said.

An informational meeting will be held on May 1 at 7 pm at the Barnes and Noble Bookstore in Fresno on Shaw and Blackstone.
