The California Student Aid Commission has \$250 million available for financial aid.

Students planning to attend college for the Fall 1997 semester are encouraged to apply before the March 2 deadline.

To apply for a Cal Grant or other state financial aid, students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) which can be picked up in the financial aid office above the admissions office. There are no exceptions to the March 2 deadline which falls on a Sunday this year. To meet the deadline, all applications must be postmarked by the 2nd. Paradise Regained




